In 2022, **Girls on the Run North Bay** was formed with the merger of Girls on the Run Napa & Solano and Girls on the Run Sonoma to reach more girls in the three counties while building a more sustainable organization. We impacted social, emotional, and physical health while providing a unique experience for our diverse communities to come together. The needs of the under-resourced communities continued to be a focus. Our staff of five, eight volunteer board members, and team of committed volunteers showed that they were StrongHER Together and were able to achieve 90% of pre-pandemic participants.

PARTICIPANT VOICES

We helped girls manage stressors related to societal pressures and gender stereotypes that negatively impact them. Over ten-weeks, a safe space was provided for girls to help counter the 30% confidence gap that typically occurs between ages 8 to 14. Three-hundred and ninety participants (390) completed paper surveys in the Fall and Spring. The surveys showed that despite the challenges, participants found the program impactful.

- 86% Are trying to be caring community members

- 72% Are sure of themselves
- 65% Celebrate what makes them unique
- 97% To help me deal with strong emotions

Bold Diverse Volunteer Mentors

Two-hundred and forty-six (246) community members volunteered and opened their hearts to lead 105 groups. Teachers, parents, grandparents, caregivers, yard duty staff, and passionate champions brought the curriculum to life for the participants and built impactful relationships. For the first time, we opened the window for multi-lingual and Spanish only speaking leaders within our community. With 42% diversity within our volunteer life coach roles, we continue to focus on increasing this so that our leaders are more representative of our participants.

FAMILY VOICES

In the Spring, one-hundred and fourteen (114) North Bay caregivers completed an online end of program survey compiled by Girls on the Run International and the results are in:

- 96% GOTR has been a valuable experience for their child
- 93% the GOTR experience helped my child gain skills to help her handle the stress
- 80% their child is more confident

GOTR 5KS AND COMMUNITY IMPACT

The Spring StrongHER Together Girls on the Run 5K presented by Kaiser Permanente welcomed 1,270 5K participants. The Fall BeYOUnique Girls on the Run 5K presented by Community Projects had 1,400 participants.

Girls on the Run groups completed community impact projects that supported teachers, animals, the homeless, the environment, and children in the hospital. Collectively, participants contributed over 3,500 hours of service.

ACHIEVED FINANCIALS & MORE SUSTAINABLE

The new Girls on the Run North Bay team and Board **raised revenue to meet expenses** of \$554,000 for the merged organization in 2022. This achievement is **95% greater than the prior year.** We ended with a small surplus of \$1,134. Thanks to the generosity of the Napa Valley Vintners, local family foundations, sponsors, and our Circle of Super Star donors, we have \$68,000 in reserve for 2023. Girls on the Run Sonoma reserves were captured in 2022 revenue. Long-time partners Community Projects and Kaiser Permanente continued to support our mission.

The Team successfully worked together to expand our reach while maintaining a quality program experience. We partnered within our communities to impact under-resourced community members' mental and physical health. The Vallejo City Unified School District provided financial support for their participants. We participated in the Napa County Community Organizations Active in Disasters, Community Leaders Coalition Steering Committee, and Santa Rosa Violence Prevention Partnership.
